Since the £6M restoration of the park recently, it's really become a really great chilled out place to spend a sunny day, and it's only a few minutes' walk from the town centre.

There's a large new area for children to play, an outdoor gym area, the beautiful pavilion (which sells fantastic ice creams), and plenty of

open space to take the dog for a walk or play a little game of football, as well as well-kept formal gardens and a few courts.

In the Summer there's quite a few gigs and events at the bandstand in the park – so keep your eyes peeled for listings!

Haigh Hall & Country Park

Haigh Hall Country Park will always be in the top list of things to do in Wigan. With extensive land and woods surrounding, as well as the Georgian stately home itself – you can spend a full day there wandering around this 200-acre park. There's a number of woodland and historical walks you can take.

While they are upgrading the amenities – to preserve the house and keep from becoming too damaged, it will be still open to the public and always free to visit.

There's a great park area for kids, as well as a cafeteria, crazy golf, multiple gardens, and the miniature railway. There's also a great view of Wigan from the hall itself – see if you can spot your house! Haigh Hall and Country Park, School Lane, Haigh, Wigan, WN2 1PE

Scotsman's Flash

Scotman's Flash is the closest and the largest of the Wigan Flashes to the town centre – and it's a real beautiful escape from busy town – an oasis right near the heart of Wigan.

It's now a nature reserve and there's a variety of birdlife (over 200 species!), mammals and amphibians for you to see as you walk around the water.

During the Summer there are several inexpensive activities on the lake, such as canoeing and sailing (for all age groups), but it's also just nice to walk around and try to spot wildlife and have a picnic by the water.

Leeds Liverpool Canal

It's an easy walk down the canal and great for a quick cycle.

If you're feeling fit, then going all the way to Appley Bridge or even Parbold is a very beautifully green and guiet, peaceful journey (you can also catch the train back if you're not up for the walk home!). But, if you just want a quick walk, finishing at with a little drink or snack at The Crooke Inn is still lovely and great for kids, as there's a little park there.



It's easy to access by the Wigan Pier, or behind DW Stadium.



Pennington Flash Nature Reserve

Welcome to a National Treasure

Pennington Flash Nature Reserve is one of the jewels in the crown of Wigan Borough and one of eight local sites comprising The Flashes of Wigan and Leigh: the only National Nature Reserve (NNR) in the whole of Greater Manchester.

Officially designated an NNR by Natural England in October 2022 in recognition of their remarkable natural beauty and immense ecological importance, these precious wetland habitats were originally and uniquely formed by the 'flash' flooding of former coal mining sites. Collectively they are now home to nationally significant wildlife populations including UK's most endangered small bird, the wonderful willow tit.

A legacy of Wigan Borough's proud industrial heritage, the Flashes are now rightly recognised as a national treasure and are a stunning example of nature in recovery. Connecting people with nature

Connecting with nature brings huge benefits for our physical and mental wellbeing, which is why we're passionate about providing more opportunities for people to get closer to nature and to explore the beauty of their surroundings.

Pennington Flash's tranquil waters and surrounding marshland boast a diverse group of mammals, birds and insects, including no fewer than five RSPB red-listed birds as well as the protected water vole. More than 230 bird species have been recorded on site, including the black-faced bunting, nightingale, cattle egret, whiskered tern and Leach's petrel. What you'll find at the Flash

Wigan Council is investing £2.7m into improving the experience of visitors to Pennington Flash with a new visitor information point and café, new accessible toilet facilities, improved parking, and a new adventure play area all designed to help you enjoy the perfect day out. 

Our Books & More service is a continuation of the library home delivery service that served our borough for many years. Working in partnership with Wigan Libraries, we offer a delivery and collection service to people across the borough who, perhaps, are unable to access their local library themselves.

In addition to delivering the books, our volunteers will stay and chat, if required, offering company and may identify other needs and can signpost for other services offered by Pensioners Link.

The service offers access to the library and, if needed, action to help reduce social isolation and wider social and community services.

'HomeSafe' is one of our services available across the whole Wigan

Borough. Working in partnership with Wigan Council and the Wigan, Wrightington and Leigh NHS Foundation Trust, we offer companionship and reassurance for patients when they are discharged from hospital.

The service is available to people who have been discharged from one of the foundation's hospitals who are over 50, live alone, or with a dependant, are mobile and live within the borough. We give the patients a follow up call with a few checks to make sure that they are comfortable and safe at home. We also provide one of our 'Welcome Home' bags that include essentials (such as tea, coffee, bread and soup) to help people get back into their usual routine. If appropriate, we can also help the patient connect to wider social services and events that they may need.

An important intervention that helps to reduce re-admission into hospital and social isolation.

This popular service relies on the help, support and commitment from our team of volunteers who - without their help - this service would not be able to function.

Please note that this service can only be booked by medical staff responsible for hospital discharges and cannot be booked directly by the public.

Ingredients: 2 fresh tuna steaks, about 175g/6oz each,

- 1 tbsp <u>olive oil</u> 1 tbsp <u>lemon juice</u>,
- 1 large garlic clove, crushed,
- 1 tbsp <u>chopped rosemary</u> leaves. For the salad,
- 410g can cannellini bean, drained and rinsed,
- 8 cherry tomatoes, quartered,
- 1/2 small red onion, thinly sliced, 50g bag rocket,
- 2 tbsp extra-virgin olive oil, 1 tbsp lemon juice
- 1 tsp wholegrain mustard 1 tsp clear honey

Meat lovers' pasta salad

Ingredients: 3/4 pound **Pasta (Fusilli** is good) half-inch slice **Salami** (cut in cubes, approx 1/4 lb) half-inch slice Sopressata (cut in cubes, approx1/4 lb) half-inch slice Ham (cut in cubes, approx 1/4 lb) 8 slices **Bacon** (cooked and crumbled) 1 Small Persian Cucumber diced (A third of an English cucumber will do) A third of a **Red Onion (diced)** 1 cup Cherry Tomatoes (halved) 1 Bell Pepper (diced) 1 third cup Black Olives (sliced) add Radishes (if you have them, guartered) 1 cup Feta Cheese (cut in small cubes) Add handful Fresh Thyme And Oregano (leaves) 2 Lemons (juice of) Half a cup **Good Olive Oil** 6 tablespoons Champagne Vinegar Half a teaspoon Dried Italian Herb Blen 1/4 teaspoon Salt, half ateaspoon Red Pepper Flakes

Our Books & More service can be a vital lifeline for lonely & isolated people. Our volunteers collect books from the library, deliver them to their reader in their home and sit with them for up to an hour for a chat. Once a month.



T.L.C. (Time Limited Contact scheme) is our shopping service. Volunteers assist people who are experiencing a time of change, by doing their shopping for up to 6 visits, to help them to get back on their feet.

HOMESAFE

Our Homesafe service supports patients being discharged from hospital. As a volunteer you would collect the patient from hospital and accompany them home ensuring that they arrive safely and are signposted to additional support if needed.
